1. The House met pursuant to adjournment.-Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.

2. PAPER.—Mr. Barton presented, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General-

Copies of Telegrams from State Premiers re Property Acquisition Bill.

Read by the Clerk, and ordered to lie on the Table.

- 3. POST AND TELEGRAPH BILL.-The Order of the Day for the third reading of this Bill having been read-Mr. Deakin moved, That the Bill be now recommitted to a Committee of the whole House for the reconsideration of clause 1.

 - Question—put and resolved in the affirmative. Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.
 - Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; Mr. Chanter reported that the Committee had reconsidered clause 1, and had agreed to the same with an amendment.
 - Mr. Deakin moved, by leave, That the further Report from the Committee of the whole House on the Bill be now adopted.

 - Question—put and resolved in the affirmative. Mr. Deakin moved, by leave, That the Bill be now read a third time.
 - Debate ensued.

Question-put and resolved in the affirmative-Bill read a third time.

4. IMMIGRATION RESTRICTION BILL.—The Order of the Day for the further consideration of this Bill in Committee of the whole House having been read-Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; Mr. Chanter reported that the Committee had made progress in the Bill, and that he was directed to ask, That the Committee may have leave to sit again. Resolved-That the House will, to-morrow, again resolve itself into the said Committee.
