WEDNESDAY, 2ND APRIL, 1902.

1. The House met pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. PATENTS AND TRADE MARKS APPLIED FOR.—Sir Langdon Bonython moved, pursuant to notice, That a Return be laid on the Table of this House showing the number of applications for Letters Patent, Provisional Protection, and Trade Marks, &c., up to the end of 1901, in the following form:—
