No. 29. Patents Bill-Senate's Message No. 35-

Amendments made by the House of Representatives to which the Senate has disagreed.

No. 56.—Page 16, before clause 83, insert the following new clauses :-

"82A. Every patent shall be granted subject to the following conditions :--- Working of patents.

"(a) That if the patented article is reasonably capable of being commercially constructed or manufactured or the invention patented is reasonably capable of being commercially

- worked in Australia the patentee or some person authorized by him shall within five years after the date thereof commence and after such commencement continuously carry on in Australia the construction or manufacture of the patented article or the working of the invention patented in such a manner that any person may obtain the patented article or the use of the invention at a reasonable price ; and
- "(b) That if the patented article is reasonably capable of being commercially constructed or manufactured in Australia the patentee shall not after four years from the date of the patent import it or cause it to be imported into Australia.
- "82B. No proceedings shall be instituted for the revocation of a patent for Proceedings for breach of working conditions. any breach of the provisions of the preceding section except in the High Court and by the Attorney-General, and then only in case the Attorney-General is satisfied that the breach is injurious to the trade or manufactures of the Commonwealth."
