- 4. Postponement of Order of the Day No. 1 be postponed until after Order of the Day No. 2, Government Business.
- 5. CONCILIATION AND ARBITRATION BILL (1926).—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—Debate resumed.
