- 1. The House met, at eleven o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Sir Littleton Groom) took the Chair, and read Prayers.

- LAND TAX ASSESSMENT BILL (1927).—Mr. Earle Page (Treasurer) moved, pursuant to notice, That
 he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to amend the Land Tax Assessment Act 1910-1926.
 Question—put and passed.

Mr. Earle Page then brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

Mr. Earle Page moved, by leave, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Mr. Scullin moved, That the debate be now adjourned.

Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.

Ordered-That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

 ELECTORAL BILL (1927).—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time— Debate resumed.
