## THURSDAY, 1ST MARCH, 1928.

- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Sir Littleton Groom) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. Want of Confidence in the Government.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the following motion of Mr. Charlton:—That, in the opinion of this House, the Government is deserving of severe censure for its failure to adequately protect Australian industries and to limit migration to the nation's ability to absorb new arrivals, together with its neglect to formulate proposals to deal with unemployment—Debate resumed.
  - Mr. R. W. Foster addressing the House, and not having concluded his speech, the House ordered that the honorable Member have leave to continue his speech when the debate is resumed.
  - Ordered—That the debate be now adjourned, and that the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.
- 3. Adjournment.—Mr. Earle Page (Treasurer) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Question—put and passed.
- And then the House, at eleven minutes past eleven o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow at eleven
