1. The House met, at eleven o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Norman J. Q. Makin) took the Chair, and offered Prayers.
2. INCOME TAX ASSESSMENT BILL (1930).—The Order of the Day having been read for the second reading—Mr. Theodore (Treasurer) moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.  
Mr. Earle Page moved, That the debate be now adjourned.  
Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.  
Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.
3. PERMANENT COURT OF INTERNATIONAL JUSTICE—APPROVAL OF DECLARATION UNDER ARTICLE 36 OF THE STATUTE.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the following motion of Mr. Scullin (Prime Minister):—That this House approves of the Declaration under Article 36 of the Statute of the Permanent Court of International Justice, signed at Geneva on 20th September, 1929, in respect of the Commonwealth of Australia—  
Debate resumed.  
Question—put and passed.
4. PERMANENT COURT OF INTERNATIONAL JUSTICE—PROTOCOL FOR REVISION OF STATUTE.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the following motion of Mr. Scullin (Prime Minister):—That this House approves the Protocol for the Revision of the Statute of the Permanent Court of International Justice, dated Geneva, 14th September, 1929—  
Question—put and passed.
5. PERMANENT COURT OF INTERNATIONAL JUSTICE—PROTOCOL FOR ACCESSION OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA TO PROTOCOL OF SIGNATURE OF STATUTE.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the following motion of Mr. Scullin (Prime Minister):—That this House approves the Protocol for the Accession of the United States of America to the Protocol of Signature of the Statute of the Permanent Court of International Justice, dated Geneva, 14th September, 1929—  
Question—put and passed.
6. PAPERS.—The following Papers were presented, pursuant to Statute—  
Navigation Act—Regulations Amended—Statutory Rules 1930, No. 59.  
Public Service Act—Regulations Amended—Statutory Rules 1930, No. 69.
7. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Scullin (Prime Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn.  
Question—put and passed.
