- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.-Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Norman J. O. Makin) took the Chair, and offered Prayers.
- 2. ADJOURNMENT-MOTION FOR PURPOSE OF DISCUSSION .--- Mr. Earle Page rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The necessity for securing at the earliest possible moment an Australian Government, controlling a majority in both Houses of the Federal Perliament, which will be able to handle with confidence, certainty and swiftness in concert with the National Government of Great Britain, the constantly changing emergencies of their common crisis "

Mr. Speaker thereupon called upon those Members who approved of the proposed discussion to rise in their places, and more than the necessary number of Members having risen accordingly-. Mr. Earle Page moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Debate ensued.

Member named.-Mr. Speaker named the honorable Member for Hunter (Mr. James) for disregarding the authority of the Chair.

- Mr. Scullin (Prime Minister) having addressed the House, and Mr. James having expressed his regret, the matter was not further proceeded with.
- Debate continued. Question-put and negatived.
