## TUESDAY, 15TH MARCH, 1932.

- 1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable G. H. Mackay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. PAPERS.—The following Paper was presented, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General— Tuberculosis—Formulae disclosed by M. Spahlinger—
  - (a) Statement given to a meeting in London at which the announcement of the formulae was made:
  - (b) Principles on which the method of preparing specific antigens are based;
  - (c) Method of preparation of the antigens for preventive immunization of cattle;
  - (d) Method of preparation of the antigens for the preventive vaccination of human beings.

Ordered to lie on the Table.

Message No. 4.

A Proposed Law intituled "Insurance Act 1932," as finally passed by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth, having been presented to the Governor-General for the Royal Assent, His Excellency has, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, assented to the said Law.

- 4. Correction of Error in Division List.—Mr. Speaker informed the House that in the last Division in Committee taken on Friday, the 11th instant, the Tellers inadvertently made an error. The name of Mr. Beasley should have been included in the List of those Members who voted with the Noes, instead of the name of Mr. Blakeley. The error would be rectified in the official records.
- 5. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—UNEMPLOYMENT.—Mr. Lyons (Prime Minister), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement announcing the text of a telegram sent by him to the State Premiers in connexion with the proposals of the Commonwealth Government regarding unemployment.

- 6. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—CENTRAL WOOL COMMITTEE.—Mr. Lyons (Prime Minister), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement in appreciation of the work of the Central Wool Committee.
- 7. ALTERATION OF HOUR OF NEXT MEETING.-Mr. Lyons (Prime Minister) moved, That the House, at its rising, adjourn until eleven o'clock a.m. to-morrow. Debate ensued.

Question—put and passed.

- 8. POSTPONEMENT OF ORDER OF THE DAY.—Ordered—That Order of the Day No. 1 be postponed until after Order of the Day No. 2.
- 9. WAR SERVICE HOMES BILL (1932).—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time-

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

(In the Committee.)

Clauses 1 and 2 agreed to.

Mr. James moved, as an amendment, That the words "cancellation of the contract" (page 2, line 6) be omitted with a view to the insertion of the words "the mutual vacation of the property" in place thereof.

Debate ensued.

Amendment negatived.

Mr. White moved, as an amendment, That after the word "necessary," (page 2, line 14) the words "not exceeding two and one-half per centum of the original value of the property" be inserted. Debate ensued.

Amendment, by leave, withdrawn.

Mr. James moved, as an amendment, That after the word "determines," (page 2, line 20) the words providing the purchaser or borrower has been and is in reasonable employment" be inserted. Debate ensued.

Amendment negatived.

On the motion of Mr. McNicoll, the following amendment was made, after debate :-

Page 2, line 25, after "pounds;" insert the following proviso: -- "Provided that the amount which the purchaser or borrower is liable to pay to the Commissioner under this paragraph shall not in any event exceed the sum of Forty pounds"

Mr. James moved, as a further amendment, That after paragraph (b) of proposed new sub-section (1c.)

the following paragraph be added :-

'(c) if at any time the Commissioner receives from the sale of a property more than the price charged to the previous purchaser (after making due allowances for the rise or fall in property values) such difference shall be credited to the previous purchaser or borrower provided that he or she can show the increased value is due to improvements made by the previous purchaser or borrower."
