4. Ways and Means [Customs Tariff (1932) and Amendment (No. 1)].—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Ways and Means.

General debate resumed on the first Item, and on the amendment moved by Mr. Thomas Paterson (see page 562) to the first paragraph of the proposed Resolution of the 13th October, 1932, the proposed amendment being as follows:—That after the words "United Kingdom" the following words be inserted:—"and that the Government without delay submit a further schedule which will carry out the terms and the spirit of the Ottawa Agreement with respect to increased preference to British goods in the following manner:—

Duties against British goods to be reduced to the level of the 1921–1930 Tariff in all cases where they have been raised above that level without report by the Tariff Board".

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Bell reported accordingly. Resolved—That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

 ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Lyons (Prime Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued. Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at eleven minutes past four o'clock p.m., adjourned until Tuesday next at three o'clock p.m.
