Question—put and passed. Paragraph, as further amended, agreed to. Group 5-Item 281, postponed sub-item (N), agreed to. Group 7-Item 123, postponed sub-item (A), debated and agreed to. Group 3-Postponed Item 19-Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed ; Mr. Bell reported accordingly. Resolved-That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

4. ADJOURNMENT.-Mr. Parkhill (Postmaster-General) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Question-put and passed.

And then the House, at six minutes to two o'clock in the morning, adjourned until this day at half-past ten o'clock a.m.
