- 2. Papers.—The following Papers were presented, pursuant to Statute— Post and Telegraph Act—Regulations Amended—Statutory Rules 1935, No. 121. Transport Workers Act—Regulations Amended—Statutory Rules 1936, No. 20.
- 3. Orange Bounty Bill (1936).—Mr. Thorby (Acting Minister for Commerce), pursuant to leave given on the 13th instant, brought up a Bill intituled "A Bill for an Act to provide for the Payment of a Bounty on the Export of Oranges from the Commonwealth", and moved, That it be now read a first

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

Ordered—That the second reading be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

4. Wheat Growers Relief Bill (1936).—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—

Debate resumed. Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.
