- 1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable G. J. Bell) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. Adjournment-Motion for Purpose of Discussion.—Mr. Curtin (Leader of the Opposition) rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The Empire Air Mail Service, and the distribution of the mails to the States of the Commonwealth".

Mr. Speaker thereupon called upon those Members who approved of the proposed discussion to rise in their places, and more than the necessary number of Members having risen accordingly-

Mr. Curtin moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Debate ensued.

Mr. Thorby (Minister for Defence) addressing the House and not having concluded his speech at the termination of the time allowed by Standing Order No. 257B-

Ordered—That the honorable Member have leave to continue his speech.

Debate continued.

The debate having been continued for two hours, it was terminated in accordance with Standing Order

6. Message from the Administrator.—National Health and Pensions Insurance Bill 1938.—The following Message from His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth was presented, and was read by Mr. Speaker :--

In accordance with the requirements of section 56 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth recommends to the House of Representatives that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of amendments to be moved by the Treasurer in a Bill for an Act to provide for Insurance against certain Contingencies affecting Employees, and the Wives, Children, Widows, and Orphans of Employees, and for other purposes.

Canberra, 3rd June, 1938.

Ordered-That the foregoing Message be taken into consideration, in Committee of the whole House, forthwith.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

Mr. Casey (Treasurer) moved, That it is expedient that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of amendments to be moved by the Treasurer in a Bill for an Act to provide for Insurance against certain Contingencies affecting Employees, and the Wives, Children, Widows, and Orphans of Employees, and for other purposes.

Mr. Curtin (Leader of the Opposition) proposing to move, as an amendment, That after "Treasurer" the words "and other Members" be inserted—

Chairman's Ruling.—The Chairman (Mr. Prowse) ruled that the amendment would not be in order as it was beyond the scope of the Administrator's recommendation.

Dissent from Chairman's Ruling.—Mr. Curtin having handed in, in writing, an objection to the Ruling of the Chairman, moved, That the Ruling be dissented from.

Clause 7 debated and agreed to.

Clauses 8 to 16 agreed to.

Clause 17-

Mr. Hawker moved, as an amendment, That the words "aboriginal natives of Australia or" (lines 15-16) be omitted.

Debate ensued.

Chairman's Ruling.—The Chairman (Mr. Prowse) ruled the amendment out of order, as it would bring in another class of contributor.

Mr. Casey (Treasurer) moved, as an amendment, That the words "(not being aboriginal natives of Australia or of the Islands of the Pacific)" (lines 15-16) be omitted.

Debate continued.

Mr. Rosevear moved, That the clause be postponed until after the First Schedule.

Debate continued.

Question—That the clause be postponed until after the First Schedule—put and negatived.

Amendment agreed to.

Clause, as amended, agreed to.

Clause 18-

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Prowse reported accordingly.

Resolved—That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

7. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Casey (Treasurer) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at thirteen minutes to eleven o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow at half-past two o'clock p.m.
