3. NATIONAL HEALTH AND PENSIONS INSURANCE BILL 1938.-The Order of the Day having been read for the further consideration of this Bill in Committee of the whole House-

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

Clause 19 debated-

Mr. James proposing to move, as an amendment, That all words after "Act" (line 31) be omitted with a view to the insertion of the words "for all purposes of this Act" in place thereof— *Chairman's Ruling.*—The Chairman (Mr. Prowse) ruled that such an amendment would extend the

benefits and, therefore, would increase the appropriation and would not be in order. Mr. James moved, That the clause be postponed.

Debate continued.

Question-That the clause be postponed-put and passed.

Clause 20 debated and agreed to.

Clause 21-

Chairman's Ruling .-- The Chairman ruled that such an amendment would not be in order as it would give certain persons benefits to which they would otherwise not be entitled, and this would necessitate additional expenditure from the Consolidated Revenue.

On the motion of Mr. Casey (Treasurer), the following amendments were made, after debate :--Page 7, line 40, after "not" insert ", while that certificate remains in force,". Page 8, line 6, after "Act" insert ", while that certificate remains in force,". Page 8, line 22, after "retires" insert ", while the certificate remains in force,". Page 8, line 36, after " shall" insert ", while that certificate remains in force,".

Debate continued.

Mr. Spender moved, as a further amendment, That the following sub-clause be added :---

"(7.) The Commission may issue a certificate in the prescribed form to a contributor who makes an application for exemption and establishes to the satisfaction of the Commission that he is a bona fide adherent to and member of a duly constituted Branch of the Christian Science Church or Society and thereupon during the currency of the said certificate the provisions of this Act relating to medical benefit shall not apply to such contributor and the amount of contribution payable by such contributor shall be reduced by such amount as the Commission shall from time to time determine :

Provided that such certificate may at any time be cancelled by the Commission if the Commission is satisfied that the holder thereof is not such an adherent to and member of such Church or Society and shall be so cancelled at the request of the holder thereof.".

Point of Order -- Mr. Holt raised a Point of Order that the amendment would increase the appropriation required, and, therefore, was not in order.

Temporary Chairman's Ruling .- The Temporary Chairman (Mr. John Lawson) ruled that the amendment was in order.

Debate continued.

Member named.— The Chairman named the honorable Member for Hunter (Mr. James) for disregarding the authority of the Chair.

Mr. James having expressed his regret, the matter was not further proceeded with. Debate continued.
