- 1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable G. J. Bell) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. Trade Agreement between the United Kingdom and the United States of America-MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—MOTION FOR PRINTING PAPER.—Sir Earle Page (Minister for Commerce), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement regarding the Trade Agreement between the United Kingdom and the United States of America, and, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General, laid upon the Table the following Paper:—

and moved, That the Paper be printed.

Mr. Forde moved, That the debate be now adjourned.

- 3. EXPORT OF PIG IRON---MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.---Mr. Lyons (Prime Minister), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House of the decision of the Government to permit the export of pig iron to be continued for the time being.
- 4. Assistance to Wheat Industry-Ministerial Statement.—Sir Earle Page (Minister for Commerce), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House of the decisions of the recent conference of Commonwealth and State Ministers in relation to plans for a home consumption price for wheat and for the alleviation of distress among wheat farmers.
- 5. PATENTS BILL 1938.—Mr. Menzies (Attorney-General), pursuant to leave given on the 17th instant, brought up a Bill intituled "A Bill for an Act to consolidate and amend the Law relating to Patents of Inventions and for other purposes", and moved, That it be now read a first time.

 Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

Ordered-That the second reading be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

6. Supply [Budget Debate].—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

(In the Committee.)

General debate resumed on the question, That the first item in the Estimates, under Division I .-The Senate—namely-

Salaries and allowances

be agreed to.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Prowse reported accordingly.
