- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable G. J. Bell) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. WAR WITH GERMANY-MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.-Mr. McEwen (Minister for External Affairs), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House of the latest news of the fighting in Belgium and France.
- 3. Paper.—The following Paper was presented, pursuant to Statute— Northern Territory Acceptance Act and Northern Territory (Administration) Act—Ordinance of 1940—No. 7—Mining Development.
- 4. Post and Telegraph Rates (Defence Forces) Bill 1940.—Mr. Thorby (Postmaster-General), pursuant to leave given on the 21st instant, brought up a Bill intituled "A Bill for an Act to amend the 'Postal Rates (Defence Forces) Act 1939', and moved, That it be now read a first time. Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

 Ordered—That the second reading be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

5. Post and Telegraph Rates Bill 1940.—Mr. Thorby (Postmaster-General), pursuant to leave given on the 21st instant, brought up a Bill intituled "A Bill for an Act to amend the Post and Telegraph Rates Act 1902-1931'", and moved, That it be now read a first time. Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

Ordered—That the second reading be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

6. Public Accounts Committee—Cessation of Suspension of Operation of Act.—Mr. Jolly moved, pursuant to notice, That, in accordance with sub-section (2.) of section two of the Committee of Public Accounts Act 1932, the suspension of the operation of the Committee of Public Accounts Act 1913-1920 should cease forthwith.

 (d) The administration by the Postmaster-General's Department of the provisions of the
 - arbitration award relating to line staffs.
