1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable W. M. Nairn) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. ALTERATION OF DAY OF NEXT MEETING.—Mr. Menzies (Prime Minister) moved, That the House, at its rising, adjourn until Monday next at three o'clock p.m.  
Question—put and passed.
3. WAR-TIME (COMPANY) TAX COMMITTEE.—Mr. Menzies announced the personnel of the Committee of Members of the House of Representatives appointed to discuss proposed war-time (company) tax legislation.
4. SUPPLY—BUDGET DEBATE.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

*(In the Committee.)*

General debate resumed on the question, That the first item in the Estimates, under Division No. I.—The Senate—namely—

be agreed to.

Ordered—That Mr. Falstein be granted an extension of time.

Debate continued.

Ordered—That Mr. James be granted extensions of time (2).

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Prowse reported accordingly.

Resolved—That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

5. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Collins (Assistant Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn.  
Debate ensued.  
Ordered—That Mr. Pollard be granted an extension of time.  
Debate continued.  
Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at twenty-six minutes to five o'clock p.m., adjourned until Monday next at three o'clock p.m.
