- 1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable J. S. Rosevear) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. PAPER.—The following Paper was presented, by command of His Royal Highness the Governor-General-

Tariff Board-Report-Raw Cotton-Questions of assisting production in Australia. Ordered to lie on the Table, and to be printed.

3. ADJOURNMENT-MOTION FOR PURPOSE OF DISCUSSION.—Mr. Corser rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The necessity for the setting up of an expert Commonwealth authority, to report to this Parliament and the States on extensive and minor water conservation and hydro-electric schemes, in order to insure against recurring devastating droughts such as that . in Queensland at the present time"

Mr. Speaker thereupon called upon those Members who approved of the proposed discussion to rise in their places, and more than the necessary number of Members having risen accordingly-

Mr. Corser moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Ordered—That Mr. Corser be granted an extension of time.

4. Message from the Governor-General.—Raw Cotton Bounty Bill 1946.—The following Message from His Royal Highness the Governor-General was presented, and was read by Mr. Speaker:-

Governor-General.

Message No. 56.

In accordance with the requirements of section fifty-six of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Governor-General recommends to the House of Representatives that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to amend the Raw Cotton Bounty Act 1940-1941.

Government House.

Canberra, 10th July, 1946.

Ordered--That the foregoing Message be taken into consideration, in Committee of the whole House, forthwith.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

(In the Committee.)

Mr. Forde (Minister representing the Minister for Trade and Customs) moved, That it is expedient that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to amend the Raw Cotton Bounty Act 1940-1941.

Question—put and passed. Resolution to be reported.

The House resumed; Mr. Riordan reported accordingly.

Mr. Forde moved, pursuant to contingent notice, That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as would prevent the remaining stages being passed without delay.

Question—put and passed.

The Resolution reported from the Committee was read, and, on the motion of Mr. Forde, was adopted by the House.

Ordered—That Mr. Forde and Mr. Scully do prepare and bring in a Bill to carry out the foregoing Resolution.

Mr. Forde then brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

Mr. Forde moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Mr. Adermann moved, That the debate be now adjourned.

Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.

Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

5. Australian Soldiers' Repatriation Bill 1946.—Mr. Frost (Minister for Repatriation), pursuant to leave given on the 17th July, brought up a Bill intituled "A Bill for an Act to amend sections eightynine and ninety of the 'Australian Soldiers' Repatriation Act 1920-1945'", and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

Mr. Frost moved, by leave, That the Bill be now read a second time. Mr. Harrison moved, That the debate be now adjourned.

Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.

Ordered-That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

6. Wheat Industry Stabilization Bill 1946.—The Order of the Day having been read for the further consideration of this Bill in Committee of the whole House-

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

(In the Committee.)

Clause 2—

Consideration resumed of the following new clause proposed by Mr. Scully (Minister for Commerce and Agriculture) :-

"2. The several sections of this Act shall commence on such dates as are commencement. respectively fixed by Proclamation."—

And of the amendment moved thereto by Mr. Cameron, viz.: - That the following words be added to the proposed new clause :--", but not earlier than the first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and forty-six ".

Amendment negatived.

New clause agreed to.

Clause 3 agreed to.

Clause 4 debated-

Mr. McEwen moved, as an amendment, That after "Australia" (page 2, line 15) the words "who shall hold office for three years from the dates of their appointments" be inserted. Debate continued.

Amendment temporarily withdrawn, by leave.

Mr. Cameron moved, as an amendment, That the word "two" (page 2, line 8) be omitted and the word "three" be inserted in place thereof.

Debate continued.

Amendment negatived.

Mr. Cameron moved, as an amendment, That the word "one" (page 2, line 12) be omitted and the word "two" be inserted in place thereof.

Amendment negatived.

Mr. Cameron moved, as an amendment, That the word "one" (page 2, line 14) be omitted and the word "two" be inserted in place thereof.

Clause 18-

Mr. McEwen moved, as an amendment, That the word "any" (page 5, line 44) be omitted and the word and figures "the 1946-47" be inserted in place thereof.

Debate ensued.

Amendment negatived.

Mr. McEwen moved, as an amendment, That the words "free on rail at the port from which it is normally exported" (page 6, lines 3 and 4) be omitted and the words "bagged at growers' sidings" be inserted in place thereof.

Chairman's Ruling.—The Chairman (Mr. Riordan) ruled that the amendment could not be accepted

as its effect would be to increase the amount of the appropriation required.

Debate on clause continued.

Mr. McEwen moved, as an amendment, That paragraphs (c) and (d) of sub-clause (3.) be omitted. Chairman's Ruling.—The Chairman ruled that the amendment, if agreed to, would increase the amount of the appropriation required and, therefore, could not be accepted.

Mr. McEwen moved, as a further amendment, That the following sub-clause be added to the clause:—
"(7.) The net return to the Board of all wheat sold in Australia by Government direction at a price less than export parity at the time of sale shall be the export parity price, and the difference (if any) shall be paid by the Government to the Board.".

Chairman's Ruling.—The Chairman ruled that the amendment, if agreed to, would require an additional appropriation, and therefore it could not be accepted.

Clause, as amended, agreed to.

Clause 19 agreed to.

Clause 20-

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Riordan reported accordingly.

Resolved-That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

7. Adjournment.—Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued.

Mr. Calwell (Minister for Immigration) moved, That Mr. Morgan be granted an extension of time. Question—put and negatived.
