- 2. Message from the Governor-General.—Assent to Bill.—The following Message from His Excellency the Governor-General was received, and was read by Mr. Deputy Speaker: -

A Proposed Law intituled "Social Services Consolidation Act 1948" as finally passed by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth, having been presented to the Governor-General for the Royal Assent, His Excellency has, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, assented to the said Law.

3. Adjournment-Motion for Purpose of Discussion.—Mr. Spender rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of liscussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The serious penetration, with Governmental approval or permission, of subversive influences into the instruments of Government and the use of Governmental agencies, in particular, the Commonwealth Office of Education for purposes subversive of the interests of Australia, and the use of public moneys to such purposes".
