- 2. JOINT COMMITTEE ON THE BROADCASTING OF PARLIAMENTARY PROCEEDINGS-PUBLICATION OF PROCEEDINGS-STATEMENT BY MR. DEPUTY SPEAKER .-- Mr. Deputy Speaker informed the House of certain declarations by the Joint Committee on the Broadcasting of Parliamentary Proceedings in relation to the publication of the proceedings and decisions of the Committee, and stated that, in view of these declarations, any unauthorized publication of the proceedings of the Committee may be considered by the House as a breach of privilege.
- 3. ADJOURNMENT-MOTION FOR PURPOSE OF DISCUSSION .- Mr. Francis rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The failure of the Government to implement effectively the Commonwealth Reconstruction Training Scheme, and to honour the promises made to ex-servicemen and women in this and in other rehabilitation matters".

Mr. Deputy Speaker thereupon called upon those Members who approved of the proposed discussion to rise in their places, and more than the necessary number of Members having risen accordingly-Mr. Francis moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Ordered-That Mr. Francis be granted an extension of time.

Debate ensued.

Ordered-That Mr. Dedman (Minister for Post-war Reconstruction) be granted an extension of time. Debate continued.
