Question-put and passed.
- 4. CENSURE MOTION.-Mr. Menzies (Leader of the Opposition) moved, pursuant to notice, That in the opinion of this House the present shortage of petrol supplies in Australia, which is increasingly affecting vital production and transport, is to a substantial extent due to the policy and inaction of the Government, and that the Government in consequence deserves the censure of this House. Debate ensued.
  - Suspension of Standing Orders .- Mr. Chifley (Prime Minister) moved, by leave, That so much of the Standing Örders be suspended as would prevent Mr. Fadden from concluding his speech without interruption.
