- 3. - 6. Ways and Means-Stevedoring Industry Charge.-The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Ways and Means.

Mr. Dedman (Minister representing the Minister for Shipping and Fuel) moved, That, on and after the eleventh day of October, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, in lieu of the rate imposed by the Stevedoring Industry Charge Act 1947, the rate of the charge in respect of the employment of waterside workers be Two pence half-penny for every man-hour of employment.

Resolved—That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

8. Adjournment.—Mr. Evatt (Attorney-General) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued.
