1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable A. G. Cameron) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. ALTERATION OF DAY OF NEXT MEETING.—Mr. Fadden (Treasurer) moved, That the House, at its rising, adjourn until to-morrow at half-past ten o'clock a.m.
Question—put and passed.
3. DRUG CORTISONE—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.—Sir Earle Page (Minister for Health), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement regarding the availability and efficacy of the drug Cortisone.
4. MYXOMATOSIS—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.—Mr. Casey (Minister for National Development), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement with reference to the value of the virus myxomatosis in rabbit destruction, and informed the House that there was no connexion between the myxomatosis virus and the encephalitis virus.
5. PAPER.—The following Paper was presented, pursuant to Statute—
Sugar Agreement Act—Nineteenth Annual Report of the Fruit Industry Sugar Concession Committee, for year ended 31st August, 1950.
6. POSTPONEMENT OF ORDER OF THE DAY.—Ordered—That Order of the Day No. 1, Government Business, be postponed until a later hour this day.

PROPOSED COAL INDUSTRY BILL—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.—Mr. Holt (Minister for Labour and National Service), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House of the Government's proposals to amend the Coal Industry Act, the Bill for which would be introduced when the concurrence of the Government of New South Wales had been notified.
9. CONCILIATION AND ARBITRATION BILL 1951.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—
Debate resumed.
