'No person other than as provided in the immediately preceding paragraph shall

import into manufacture or sell in the Territory any intoxicants. "Penalty: One hundred pounds.

"Intoxicants for the purposes of this section shall mean any wine spirits ale beer porter cider perry or other spirituous or fermented liquor of an intoxicating nature.'
