- 2. TREASURER'S SPEECH AT LOAN COUNCIL MEETING-MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.-Sir Arthur Fadden (Treasurer), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House that it was not proposed to make available the text of the statement made by the Treasurer at the recent meeting of the Loan Council.

Mr. Evatt (Leader of the Opposition), by leave, also made a statement in connexion with the matter.
