14. PRESENTATION OF ADDRESS IN REPLY.—Mr. Speaker reported that, on the 27th June, accompanied by honorable Members, he had waited upon His Excellency the Governor-General at Government House, and had presented to him the Address in Reply to His Excellency's Speech on the Opening of the First Session of the Twentieth Parliament, agreed to by the House on the 22nd June, and, that His Excellency had been pleased to make the following reply:—

MR. SPEAKER,

I desire to thank you for the Address in Reply which you have just presented to me.

It will afford me much pleasure to convey to His Most Gracious Majesty The King the Message of Loyalty from the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, to which the Address gives expression.
