DEATH OF HER EXCELLENCY LADY DE L'ISLE.-Mr. Menzies (Prime Minister) referred to the death on the 16th November of Lady De L'Isle, wife of His Excellency the Governor-General and spoke of the deep feeling which all persons in the Parliament felt for His Excellency the Governor-General and his family in their loss and the profound respect in which the memory of Lady De L'Isle was held.

Mr. Whitlam and Mr. McEwen (Minister for Trade) supported the remarks of the Prime Minister and joined in the expression of sympathy.

Mr. Speaker informed the House that on the day of Lady De L'Isle's death he had conveyed the sympathy of all honorable Members to His Excellency and members of the family.
