- 1 The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Honourable W. J. Aston) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 Bendigo by-election: Mr Speaker informed the House that he had this day issued the writ in connection with the by-election for the Bendigo Division, and that the dates fixed were those announced to the House on 23 April.
- 3 QUESTIONS: Questions without notice were asked.
- 4 WHEAT DELIVERY QUOTA PROPOSALS—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—MOTION TO TAKE NOTE OF PAPER: Mr Anthony (Minister for Primary Industry), by leave, made a ministerial statement informing the House that proposals put forward by the Australian Wheat Growers' Federation for quotas to operate on delivery of wheat to the Australian Wheat Board next season now had the full support of the wheat industry in all States, all State Governments, the Commonwealth Government and the Reserve Bank and the way was now clear for them to operate for the 1969-70 harvest. Mr Anthony then, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General, presented the following paper:

Wheat delivery quota proposals—Ministerial statement, 30 April 1969.

- Mr G. D. Erwin (Leader of the House) moved—That the House take note of the paper. Debate adjourned (Mr Patterson), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.
- 5 PAPUA AND NEW GUINEA—BORDER INCIDENT AT WUTUNG—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT:
 Mr Barnes (Minister for External Territories), by leave, made a ministerial statement
 with reference to a recent incident at Wutung near the border between the Territory
 of Papua and New Guinea and West Irian when a small group of armed, uniformed
 Indonesians entered Papua and New Guinea in search of a number of West Irianese
 who had crossed the border.
 - Mr Whitlam (Leader of the Opposition) and Mr Calwell, by leave, also made statements with reference to the matter.
- 6 DISCUSSION OF MATTER OF PUBLIC IMPORTANCE—MR SEMENOV—REFUSAL OF ENTRY TO NEW GUINEA: Mr Speaker informed the House that Mr Barnard (Deputy Leader of the Opposition) had proposed that a definite matter of public importance be submitted to the House for discussion, namely, "The Government's failure to give reasons for refusing entry to New Guinea to Mr Semenov, who had an Australian visa, and to consult members of the House of Assembly in such matters".

The proposed discussion having received the necessary support—

Mr Barnard addressed the House.

Discussion ensued.

Discussion concluded.

7 Postponement of Government Business: Ordered—That government business be postponed until after notice No. 1, general business.

- 8 SEWERAGE RATES ORDINANCE—MOTION FOR DISALLOWANCE: Mr J. R. Fraser moved, pursuant to notice—
 - (1) That the Sewerage Rates Ordinance 1968, made under the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910–1965, be disallowed, and
 - (2) That any necessary revenue be collected by means of a rate based on the assessed annual value, the improved capital value or the unimproved capital value of the land concerned.

Debate ensued.
