- 1 The House met, at two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Honourable Sir William Aston) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 Petitions: Mr Reid presented a petition from certain residents of Victoria praying that the export of all kangaroo products be banned immediately. Petition received and read.
 - Similar petitions were presented by Mr D. M. Cameron, Mr Fox and Mr Jarman, from certain residents of New South Wales, and were severally received.
- 3 QUESTIONS: Questions without notice were asked.

- 5 R.A.A.F. Base, Pearce, W.A.—Approval of work: Mr Chipp (Minister representing the Minister for Works) moved, pursuant to notice—That, in accordance with the provisions of the *Public Works Committee Act* 1969, it is expedient to carry out the following proposed work which was referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works and on which the committee has duly reported to Parliament: Development of R.A.A.F. Base at Pearce, W.A.
 - Mr Jones moved, as an amendment—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof: "so many of the recommendations of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works regarding the development of the R.A.A.F. Base at Pearce, W.A., which deal with living accommodation, be referred back to the committee for further consideration to ensure that adequate sound proofing is provided for new accommodation".

Debate continued.

Mr Jones, who had already spoken, again addressed the House, by leave.

Amendment negatived.

Motion agreed to.

6 Stores complex for 2 Base Medical and Dental Equipment Depot, Randwick, N.S.W.—Approval of work: Mr Chipp (Minister representing the Minister for Works) moved, pursuant to notice—That, in accordance with the provisions of the *Public Works Committee Act* 1969, it is expedient to carry out the following proposed work which was referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works and on which the committee has duly reported to Parliament: Construction of stores complex for 2 Base Medical and Dental Equipment Depot at Randwick, N.S.W. Question—put and passed.

7 H.M.A.S. Tarangau, Los Negros Island—Approval of work: Mr Chipp (Minister representing the Minister for Works) moved, pursuant to notice—That, in accordance with the provisions of the Public Works Committee Act 1969, it is expedient to carry out the following proposed work which was referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works and on which the committee has duly reported to Parliament: Development works at H.M.A.S. Tarangau at Los Negros Island. Debate ensued.

Question-put and passed.

8 NATIONAL HEALTH BILL 1970: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—And on the amendment moved thereto by Mr Hayden, viz.—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof: "whilst not opposing the Bill because it represents some improvement this House is of opinion that a National Health Insurance Commission financed from graduated contributions would pay for medical and hospital services for all more equitably and economically"—Debate resumed.
