WEDNESDAY, 3 JUNE 1970

- 1 The House met, at two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Honourable Sir William Aston) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 MINISTERIAL ARRANGEMENTS: Mr Gorton (Prime Minister) informed the House that, during the absence abroad of Mr Peacock (Minister for the Army), Mr Chipp (Minister for Customs and Excise) was acting as Minister for the Army.
- 3 DEATH OF FORMER MEMBER (MR R. JOSHUA, M.C.): Mr Gorton (Prime Minister) informed the House of the death, on 2 June of Mr Robert Joshua, M.C., a Member of this House for the Division of Ballaarat from 1951 to 1955, and extended deepest sympathy to his widow and family in their bereavement.
 - Mr Whitlam (Leader of the Opposition) and Mr McEwen (Leader of the Australian Country Party) supported the remarks of the Prime Minister.
 - As a mark of respect to the memory of the deceased all Members present stood, in silence.
- 4 PETITIONS: Sir Wilfrid Kent Hughes presented a petition from certain residents of Victoria praying that the export of all kangaroo products be banned immediately. Petition received and read.

Similar petitions were presented by Mr Crean, and by Mr Dobie, from certain residents of New South Wales, and were severally received.

Mr Beazley presented a petition from certain citizens of Western Australia praying that the House consider the hardship caused to home buyers in that State by the increased interest rates on mortgage contracts which result from the recent increase in the interest rate on Government Bonds.

Petition received and read.

- Similar petitions to that presented by Mr Beazley, were presented by Mr Hallett and Mr Maisey, and were severally received.
- Mr Martin presented a petition from certain citizens of New South Wales praying that this House take immediate steps to increase the base pension rate to 30 per cent of average weekly male earnings.
- Mr Turner presented a petition from certain citizens of the Commonwealth praying that this House make legal provision for (1) the allowance of personal education expenses as a taxation deduction, (2) the removal of the present age limit in respect of the deduction for education expenses, (3) an increase in the deduction allowable for tertiary education expenses, (4) an increase in the maintenance allowance for students and (5) the exemption of non-bonded scholarships for part-time students from income tax.
- Mr Scholes presented a petition from certain citizens of the Commonwealth praying that this House make legal provision for (1) a joint Commonwealth-State inquiry into inequalities in Australian education, (2) the immediate financing of special programmes for low income earners and others and (3) the provision of pre-school opportunities for all children.

Petitions severally received and read.

5 QUESTIONS: Questions without notice were asked.

- 6 MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL—ASSENT TO BILL: A message from His Excellency the Governor-General was announced informing the House that His Excellency Sin the name of Her Majesty, had assented to the following Bill: 2 June 1970-Message No. 27-Homes Savings Grant 1970.
- 7 PARLIAMENTARY LIBRARIAN—APPOINTMENT: Mr Speaker informed the House of the appointment of Mr A. L. Moore to succeed Mr A. P. Fleming as Head of the Department of the Parliamentary Library.
- 8 DISCHARGE OF ORDERS OF THE DAY: Mr Snedden (Leader of the House) moved, by leave-That the following orders of the day, government business, be discharged:
 - 33 Commonwealth Employees' Compensation Bill 1970: Second reading-Resumption of debate.
 - 35 Air Accidents (Commonwealth Liability) Bill 1970: Second reading-Resumption of debate.

Question-put and passed.

9 SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDER 103: Mr Snedden (Leader of the House) moved, pursuant to notice-That standing order 103 (eleven o'clock rule) be suspended for this sitting.

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10 QUEENSLAND GRANT (BUNDABERG IRRIGATION WORKS) BILL 1970: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—And on the amendment moved thereto by Mr Patterson, viz.—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof: "the technical evaluation and any cost benefit analyses carried out by the Commonwealth for the project near Bundaberg be made available to this House"—

Debate resumed.

Amendment negatived.

- Message from the Governor-General: Mr Speaker announced the receipt of message No. 28, dated 12 March 1970, from His Excellency the Governor-General recommending an appropriation of revenue for the purposes of the Bill.

The House resolved itself into a committee of the whole.

In the committee

Bill, by leave, taken as a whole, and agreed to, after debate. Bill to be reported without amendment.

The House resumed; Mr Lucock reported accordingly.

On the motion of Mr Swartz (Minister for National Development), the House adopted the report, and, by leave, the Bill was read a third time.

11 HANDICAPPED CHILDREN (ASSISTANCE) BILL 1970: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—

Debate resumed by Mr Hayden who moved, as an amendment—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof: "whilst not opposing the provisions of the Bill, the House is of opinion that a national inquiry should be conducted to identify the nature and extent of mental and physical handicaps in children, as a basis to the Commonwealth establishing a national policy for handicapped children involving Commonwealth and State Governments, local authorities and private agencies in co-operative action". Debate continued.

It being eleven o'clock p.m.-

Adjournment negatived: Mr Speaker, in accordance with the order of the House of 16 April, proposed the question—That the House do now adjourn.

Mr Snedden (Leader of the House) requiring the question to be put forthwith without debate—

Debate resumed.

Question-put and passed-Bill read a second time.

Message from the Governor-General: Mr Speaker announced the receipt of message No. 30, dated 14 May 1970, from His Excellency the Governor-General recommending an appropriation of revenue for the purposes of the Bill.

Leave granted for third reading to be moved forthwith.

On the motion of Mr Anthony (Minister for Primary Industry), the Bill was read a third time.
