- 1 The House met, at two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Honourable J. F. Cope) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 Pertrions: The Clerk announced that the following honourable Members had each lodged petitions for presentation, viz.:
 - Dr Cairns (Minister for Overseas Trade)—from certain citizens of the Commonwealth praying that the Australian Government immediately establish diplomatic relations with the Provisional Revolutionary Government of the Republic of Vietnam and bring influence to bear in order to enable the implementation of the Agreement on Ending the War and Restoring Peace in Vietnam.
 - Dr Klugman—from certain citizens of Australia praying that this House will, in regard to the use of Commonwealth funds to aid church schools, restore to the Australian people true religious freedom which can only exist when Church and State are legally separated both in form and substance.
 - Mr Staley—from certain students and staff members of Monash University praying that Australia's official development assistance in 1972-73 be increased to at least \$240 million, and that Australia's aid and trade policies be reviewed to benefit developing countries.
 - Mr Wentworth—from certain citizens of the Commonwealth praying that (1) the management of Australia's wildlife be controlled by the Commonwealth Government and sufficient wardens be appointed to enforce the laws, (2) the shooting of kangaroos for commercial purposes be stopped immediately, (3) the export of all kangaroo products from Australia be banned and (4) the Commonwealth Government also establish large national parks of good quality land as major tourist attractions.
