- 7 INCOME TAX ASSESSMENT BILL 1973: Mr Crean (Treasurer) presented a Bill for an Act to amend the Law relating to Income Tax.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Crean moved-That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr Lynch—Deputy Leader of the Opposition), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

- 9 AUSTRALIAN CITIZENSHIP BILL 1973: Mr Grassby (Minister for Immigration), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to amend the *Citizenship Act* 1948–1969. Bill read a first time.
 - Mr Grassby moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.
 - Debate adjourned (Mr Lynch—Deputy Leader of the Opposition), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.
- 10 AUSTRALIAN INSTITUTE OF MARINE SCIENCE BILL 1973: Mr Morrison (Minister for Science), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to repeal section 8 of the Australian Institute of Marine Science Act 1972.

Bill read a first time.

- 11 DEFENCE SERVICE HOMES BILL 1973: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—Debate resumed by Mr Bonnett who moved, as an amendment—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof: "whilst not declining to give the Bill a second reading the House is of opinion that provision should have been made (a) for the effective period of service to be six years, (b) for the concessions granted to single or widowed female members of the Forces without dependants to be granted also to single or widowed male members of the Forces without dependants and (c) for amendments to be made to the Principal Act in respect of the title to the dwelling-house, unit or lot to enable the serviceman to borrow on second mortgage and give valid security to the lender".

Clauses 11 to 15, by leave, taken together, and agreed to.

Proposed new clause-

Mr Wentworth moved-That the following new clause be added to the Bill: Pension not

"16. (1) Where the Director-General is satisfied that a person has become payable to resident in Australia solely or mainly for the purpose of establishing Certain persons eligibility for a pension, he may determine that some or all of any while absent pension for which that person has become eligible should not be paid from Australia. while that person is absent from Australia.

"(2) Where a person in receipt of a pension is also in receipt of or is eligible for a pension, benefit or superannuation in some country other than Australia, and in the opinion of the Director-General that pension, benefit or superannuation corresponds to his pension in Australia, then the Director-General may determine that some or all of his Australian pension should not be payable while he is absent from Australia.

"(3) The operation of this section shall not affect any pension payable under section 13 of this Act.".

It being fifteen minutes past ten o'clock p.m.-Progress to be reported.

The House resumed; Mr Scholes reported accordingly.

- 19 ADJOURNMENT: The question was accordingly proposed—That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued.
- The House continuing to sit until eleven o'clock p.m.-Mr Speaker adjourned the House until tomorrow at ten o'clock a.m.
