TUESDAY, 10TH DECEMBER, 1907.

1. The House met pursuant to adjournment. —Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. WAYS AND MEANS.—COMMITTEE REVIVED.—Mr. Deakin moved, pursuant to *contingent* notice by Sir William Lyne, That, anything to the contrary in the Standing Orders notwithstanding, the House do immediately resolve itself into the Committee of Ways and Means, and that business be resumed at the point which it had reached at the last sitting.
Question—put and resolved in the affirmative.
Whereupon Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into the Committee of Ways and Means.
