- 3. Customs Tariff Bill (1907)—Senate's Requests.—The Order of the Day having been read for the further consideration in Committee of the whole House of the Requests made by the Senate in regard to this Bill—Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.
  - Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; Mr. McDonald reported that the Committee had made progress, and that he was directed to ask, That the Committee may have leave to sit again.
  - Resolved.—That the House will, this day, at a later hour, again resolve itself into the said Committee.
