THURSDAY, 24TH JUNE, 1909.

1. The House met pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. PAPER.—Mr. Deakin presented, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General—
Navigation Bill—Further correspondence (27th November, 1908, to 31st March, 1909) between
the Prime Minister and the Secretary of State for the Colonies. .
Ordered to lie on the Table.
3. WANT OF CONFIDENCE IN THE GOVERNMENT.—Mr. Fisher moved, pursuant to notice, That the
Government does not possess the confidence of this House.
Debate ensued.
Mr. Crouch moved, That the debate be now adjourned.
Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and resolved in the affirmative.
Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for to-morrow.
