5 GRIEVANCE DEBATE: Pursuant to the provisions of standing order 106, the order of the day having been read—

Question proposed—That grievances be noted.

6 DISCUSSION OF MATTER OF PUBLIC IMPORTANCE—MIGRANT SERVICES: Mr Deputy Speaker informed the House that Mr Innes had proposed that a definite matter of public importance be submitted to the House for discussion, namely, "The Fraser Government's reduction and deferment of services to migrants".

The proposed discussion having received the necessary support—

Mr Innes addressed the House.

Discussion ensued.

Discussion concluded.

7 Public Accounts Committee—Report—Statement by Member: Mr Connolly (Chairman) presented the following report from the Joint Committee of Public Accounts: 165th Report—The Report of the Auditor-General—Financial year 1974—75. Ordered to be printed.

Mr Connolly, by leave, made a statement in connection with the report.

8 UNITED NATIONS—SUGAR CONFERENCE—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT: Mr Anthony (Minister for Overseas Trade), by leave, made a ministerial statement relating to the United Nations Sugar Conference, 1977, in Geneva and the finalisation of a new International Sugar Agreement.

Mr Scholes, by leave, also made a statement with reference to the matter.

9 SMALL BUSINESS FINANCE—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—PAPER NOTED: Mr Lynch (Treasurer), by leave, made a ministerial statement informing the House of Government decisions to improve the finance facilities available to small businesses, and, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General, presented the following paper:

Small business finance—Ministerial statement, 13 October 1977.

Mr Macphee (Minister for Productivity) moved—That the House take note of the paper.

Debate ensued.

Question—put and passed.

10 Message from the Senate: A message from the Senate was reported returning the following Bill without amendment:

13 October 1977-Message No. 87-Office of National Assessments 1977.

11 Broadcasting and Television Amendment Bill 1977: Mr E. L. Robinson (Minister for Post and Telecommunications), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to amend the *Broadcasting and Television Act* 1942, and for related purposes.

Bill read a first time.

Mr E. L. Robinson moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr Bowen), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

12 REMUNERATION AND ALLOWANCES AMENDMENT BILL 1977: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—

Statement by Minister: Mr Macphee (Minister representing the Attorney-General), by leave, made a statement correcting an error in his second reading speech on the Bill. Debate resumed.

Question—put and passed—Bill read a second time.

Message from the Governor-General: Message No. 60, dated 5 October 1977, from His Excellency the Governor-General was announced recommending an appropriation of revenue for the purposes of the Bill.

Leave granted for third reading to be moved forthwith.

On the motion of Mr Macphee, the Bill was read a third time.

13 APPROPRIATION BILL (No. 1) 1977-78: The House, according to order, resolved itself into a committee of the whole for the further consideration of the Bill.
