- 7 ABORIGINAL DEATHS IN CUSTODY—ROYAL COMMISSION—REPORT— PUBLICATION OF PAPER: Mr Beazley (Leader of the House), by leave, moved—That this House, in accordance with the provisions of the Parliamentary Papers Act 1908, authorises the publication of the report of the Royal Commission into Aboriginal Deaths in Custody of the inquiry into the death of the young man who died at Aurukun on 11 April 1987. Question—put and passed.
- 8 DISCUSSION OF MATTER OF PUBLIC IMPORTANCE—MINISTER FOR ARTS, SPORT, THE ENVIRONMENT, TOURISM AND TERRITORIES: The House was informed that Mr Chaney had proposed that a definite matter of public importance be submitted to the House for discussion, namely, "The failure of the Minister for Arts, Sport, the Environment, Tourism and Territories to pursue the effective integration of economic and environmental decisions".

The proposed discussion having received the necessary support— Mr Chaney addressed the House. Discussion ensued.

9 SEX DISCRIMINATION AMENDMENT BILL 1990: Mr Duffy (Attorney-General), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to amend the Sex Discrimination Act 1984.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Duffy moved-That the Bill be now read a second time.

Paper: Mr Duffy presented an explanatory memorandum to the Bill.

Debate adjourned (Mr Peacock), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

10 STEVEDORING INDUSTRY LEVY AMENDMENT BILL 1990: Mr Willis (Minister representing the Minister for Industrial Relations) presented a Bill for an Act to amend the Stevedoring Industry Levy Act 1977.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Willis moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Paper: Mr Willis presented an explanatory memorandum to the Bill.

Debate adjourned (Mr Ruddock), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

11 STEVEDORING INDUSTRY LEGISLATION AMENDMENT BILL 1990: Mr Willis (Minister representing the Minister for Industrial Relations) presented a Bill for an Act to amend the law relating to the stevedoring industry. Bill read a first time.

Mr Willis moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Paper: Mr Willis presented an explanatory memorandum to the Bill.

Debate adjourned (Mr Howard), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

12 CARRIAGE OF GOODS BY SEA BILL 1990: Mr R. J. Brown (Minister for Land Transport), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act relating to the carriage of goods by sea, and for related purposes.

Bill read a first time.

Mr R. J. Brown moved-That the Bill be now read a second time.

Paper: Mr R. J. Brown presented an explanatory memorandum to the Bill. Debate adjourned (Mr Howard), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

13 AUSTRALIA COUNCIL AMENDMENT BILL 1990: Mr Simmons (Minister for the Arts, Tourism and Territories), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to amend the *Australia Council Act 1975*, and for related purposes. Bill read a first time.

Mr Simmons moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Paper: Mr Simmons presented an explanatory memorandum to the Bill.

Debate adjourned (Mr Howard), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

14 CUSTOMS TARIFF AMENDMENT BILL 1990: Mr Beddall (Minister for Small Business and Customs) presented a Bill for an Act to amend the *Customs Tariff Act 1987* and for related purposes.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Beddall moved-That the Bill be now read a second time.

Paper: Mr Beddall presented an explanatory memorandum to the Bill.

Debate adjourned (Mr Howard), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

15 TAXATION LAWS AMENDMENT BILL (NO. 4) 1990: Mr Crean (Minister Assisting the Treasurer) presented a Bill for an Act to amend the law relating to taxation.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Crean moved-That the Bill be now read a second time.

Paper: Mr Crean presented an explanatory memorandum to the Bill.

Debate adjourned (Dr R. L. Woods), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

16 EUROPEAN BANK FOR RECONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT BILL 1990: Mr Crean (Minister Assisting the Treasurer), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act relating to the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Crean moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Paper: Mr Crean presented an explanatory memorandum to the Bill. Debate adjourned (Dr R. L. Woods), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

- 17 MIGRATION REGULATIONS—JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE: The House was informed that the Opposition Whip had nominated Mr Burr to be a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Migration Regulations in place of Mr Wilson.
- 18 SOCIAL WELFARE LEGISLATION (PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS) AMENDMENT BILL 1990: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time— Debate resumed.
- 19 ADJOURNMENT: It being 10.30 p.m.—The question was proposed—That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued.
- The House continuing to sit until 11 p.m.—The Deputy Speaker adjourned the House until tomorrow at 10 a.m.
