- 2 SOCIAL WELFARE LEGISLATION (PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS) AMENDMENT BILL 1990: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time— Debate resumed.

Question-put and passed-Bill read a second time.

Message from the Governor-General: Message No. 37, dated 26 August 1990, from His Excellency the Governor-General was announced recommending an appropriation of revenue for the purposes of the Bill.
