On the motion of Mr Bilney (Minister for Defence Science and Personnel), the following amendment was made, after debate: Clause 30, page 11, lines 36-38, omit "if the member has become subject to a return of service obligation after the commencement of the first-mentioned period", substitute "if, at the time when, or at any time after, the benefit becomes or became payable, the member is, or was, subject to a return of service obligation". Bill, as amended, agreed to.
