- 4 **DISCUSSION OF MATTER OF PUBLIC IMPORTANCE—APPM DISPUTE:** The House was informed that both Mr Kerr and Mr Connolly had proposed that definite matters of public importance be submitted to the House for discussion today. In accordance with the provisions of standing order 107, the Speaker had given priority to the matter proposed by Mr Kerr, namely, "The threat to industrial peace posed by the recent behaviour of APPM management and its repudiation of the efforts of the Tasmanian Premier and the Federal Minister for Industrial Relations to resolve the dispute".

- (3) the Minister, responsible for the AOC through the Sports portfolio, will act to prevent this blatant misuse of funds earmarked to benefit Australian athletes.
