The Senate returns to the House of Representatives the Bill for "An Act to provide for the Payment of Bounties on the Manufacture of Kerosene and Paraffin Wax from Australian Shale", to which it has agreed with the amendment indicated in the annexed Schedule, in which amendment the Senate requests the concurrence of the House of Representatives.

SCHEDULE OF THE AMENDMENT MADE BY THE SENATE.

Page 3, after Clause 8, insert the following new clause:-

8A. A return setting forth-

Return to be laid before Parliament.

(a) the names of all persons to whom bounties were paid during the preceding financial year;

(b) the amounts of all such bounties;

(c) the goods in respect of which the bounties were paid;

(d) the names of the places and States in which the goods were manufactured;

(e) the number of persons employed in each of the works, wages paid, and hours observed in the production of the goods,

shall be prepared in the month of July in each year and shall be laid before both Houses of the Parliament within thirty days after its preparation if the Parliament is then sitting, and if not, then within thirty days after the next meeting thereof.

On the motion of Mr. Tudor the House agreed to the amendment.

5. Message from the Senate.—Land Tax Assessment Bill.—Mr. Speaker announced the receipt of the following Message from the Senate:—

The Senate returns to the House of Representatives the Bill for "An Act relating to the Imposition, Assessment, and Collection of a Land Tax upon Unimproved Values", to which it has agreed with the amendments indicated in the annexed Schedule, in which amendments the Senate requests the concurrence of the House of Representatives.
