Mr. Charlton moved, by leave, That the Report be adopted. Question—put and passed.

3. PAPER.—The following Paper was presented, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General— Department of Home Affairs-

Strategic Railway from Brisbane to Port Augusta viâ Hay-Report on, by Mr. Combes.

Ordered to lie on the Table, and to be printed.

- 4. DEPARTMENT OF HOME AFFAIRS—ROYAL COMMISSION OF INQUIRY.—Mr. Tudor informed the House that the Government proposed to appoint a Royal Commission, probably a Judge, to inquire into the charges made in the House in regard to the Department of Home Affairs.
- 5. ADJOURNMENT-MOTION FOR PURPOSE OF DISCUSSION.-Mr. Charlton rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The embargo placed upon the export of coal to foreign ports".

Mr. Speaker thereupon called upon those Members who approved of the proposed discussion to rise in

their places, and more than the necessary number of Members having risen accordingly-

Mr. Charlton moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Debate ensued.

Question—put and negatived.

6. Supply [Budget Debate].—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

(In the Committee.)

Question again proposed (see p. 426 ante), That the first item in the Estimates, under Division I. -The Parliament—namely—

> The President £1,100

be agreed to.

General debate resumed.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Chanter reported accordingly. Resolved—That the House will, to-morrow, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

7. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Tudor moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Debate ensued.

Question-put and passed.

And then the House, at six minutes past eleven o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow at half-past ten
