A Bill intituled "Supply Act (No. 4) 1920-21," as finally passed by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth, having been presented to the Deputy of the Governor-General for the Royal Assent, His Excellency has, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty assented to the said Act.

3. Supply [Budget Debate].—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.
