



Dementia inquiry heads to regional Western Australia

The House of Representatives Standing Committee on Health and Ageing's inquiry into early diagnosis and intervention of dementia will be held in Broome on Tuesday, 13 November 2012. The hearing will provide the Committee with the opportunity to hear from a range of stakeholders including those who assist persons with dementia once a diagnosis of dementia has been established.

The Committee will also hear from two carers who are currently looking after family members living with dementia. Their insights will be particularly valuable in assisting the Committee to gain an understanding of how a diagnosis of dementia affects individuals and their families.
