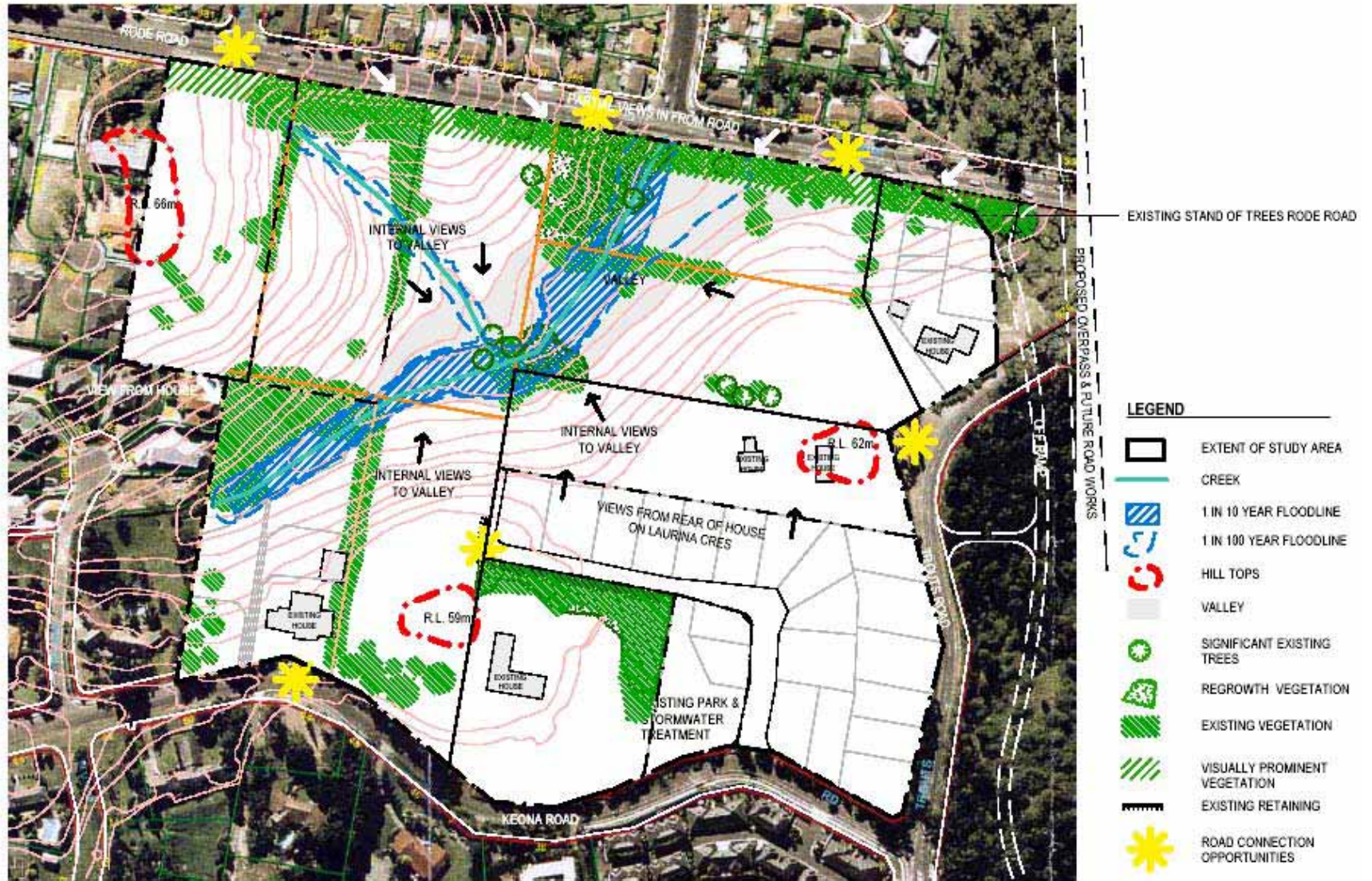

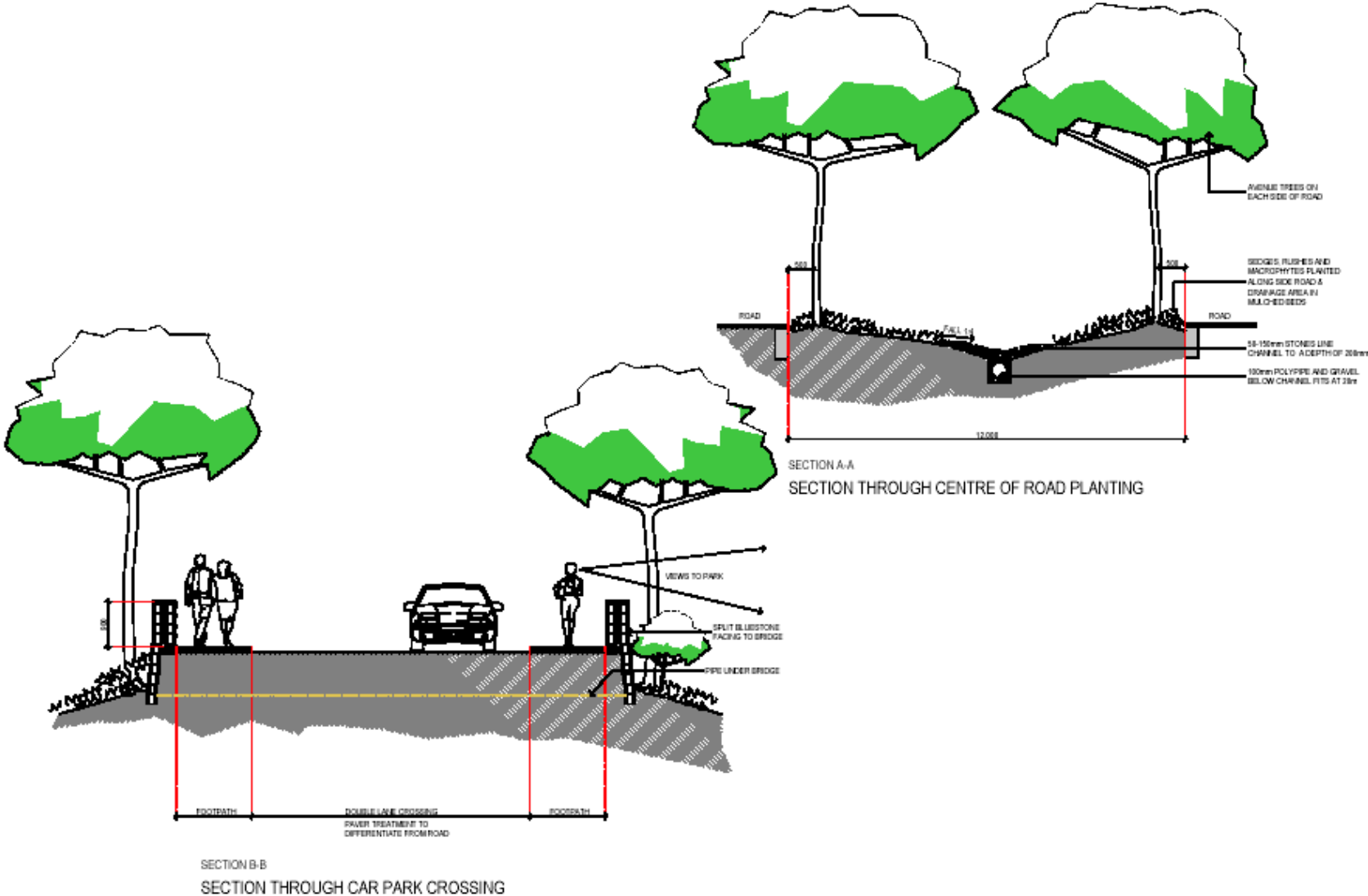

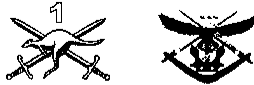

**Re: PROPOSED HOUSING DEVELOPMENT AT MCDOWALL**

*Dear Mr Bear,*

In my capacity as Commander of the 1<sup>st</sup> Division/DJFHQ, I would like to offer my strong support for the Defence Housing proposal to provide fifty-one new residences at McDowall.

I would like to stress the point that successive Defence White Papers issued by Government have recognised the unique requirements of Service life. The Profession of Arms is significantly different to civilian employment, affecting Service families in various ways. Besides being subject to strict disciplinary requirements, arduous and often dangerous physical conditions, ADF personnel can be relocated at short notice and are subject to frequent and extended absences from home. Spouses share fully in the consequential family disruption.

On the part of the Service member, these restrictions can make for a difficult employment situation, and it will often require a continual sense of duty, dedication and esprit de corps to overcome these challenges. Family support is both necessary and important. Proximity of the home environment to the base is important to reduce time pressures and stress. It is critical for family support, individual and unit morale and essential for retention of personnel in the Army. Services that are available in McDowall add further weight to the argument for such housing. There are schools, shopping centres, excellent public transport networks, only 7km from Gallipoli Barracks and 10km from Brisbane CBD. All of these factors contribute to family morale and ultimately retention.

The situation presently exists where military personnel are often driving forty minutes one way to work from their service residence. This situation is unacceptable. The opportunity now exists to help alleviate these pressures on many families by constructing new residences in McDowall and this opportunity should be actioned.

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As the Commander of 1<sup>st</sup> Division/DJFHQ, I can only applaud DHA's intention to provide new dwellings at McDowall. I believe the initiative will not only provide modern housing but also assist in maintaining morale, and facilitate family support for what is always a challenging career choice.

RE: REDEVELOPMENT OF RESIDENTIAL AREA AT McDOWALL, BRISBANE

In my capacity as National Convenor for Defence Families of Australia (DFA), I would like to comment on the Defence Housing proposal to provide a significant number of new Service Residences in the Brisbane suburb of McDowall.

Due to the unique working and lifestyle conditions of Australian Defence Force (ADF) members and their families, I believe there are several points which need to be considered in regard to location when providing Services Residences:

- Providing a choice of residence in close proximity to the Gallipoli Barracks allows ADF members to live close to where they work, thus minimising travel time. Due to unusual working hours, this is particularly important as it increases time for families to be together, where long hours and extended periods of absence takes its toll on family life.
- As ADF personnel are deployed for lengthy periods of time, being able to live in a community close to other service families and close to the Barracks provides both a family support network and security.
- Often ADF members are required to work any time of the day or night, including weekends. This puts enormous strain on family life, especially if the family has only one car. Close proximity to the Barracks really does alleviate this strain.

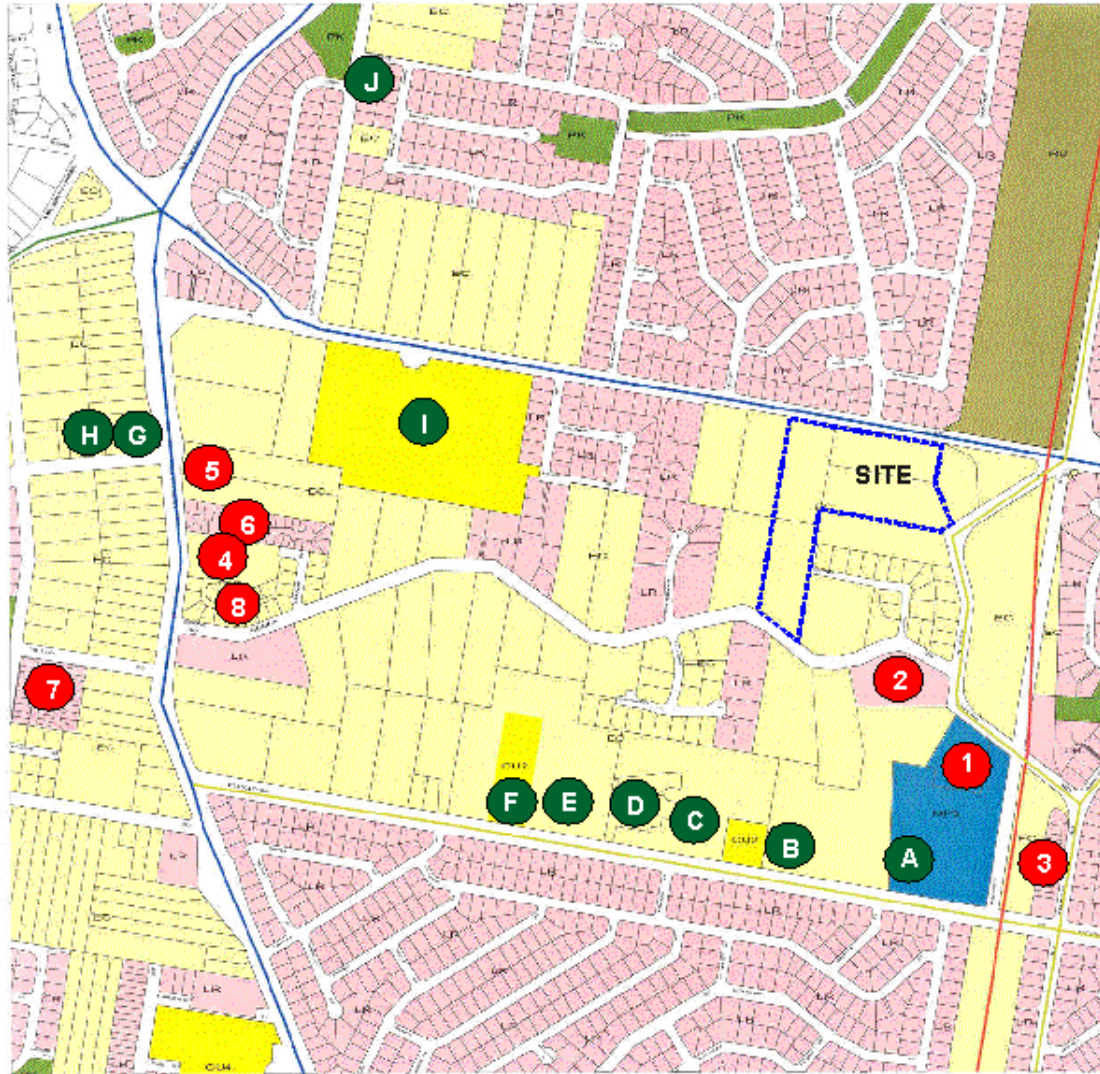
- The Barracks provides recreational and sporting facilities for use by members to maintain the required standard of physical fitness. These facilities also provide a social platform for spouses and a safe environment for their own exercise, which in turn alleviates stress. The Barracks also offers spouse and community activities throughout the year. During the East Timor and Iraq deployments, the Barracks offered an extensive support network as well as information sessions for the families, which proved to be vitally important considering the uncertain times.
- By building Service Residences in established suburbs, the families have readily available access to schools and employment opportunities for spouses. This is of particular note given the Barracks' proximity to the CBD. This ideal location also provides child care options, shopping centres, hospitals, etc, all of which have been proven to assist with the retention of ADF members and their families.

As the National Convenor for DFA, I completely support the Defence Housing Authority's intention to build Service Residences in close proximity to Enoggera. I believe the initiative would not only provide modern residences which meet the ADF families' needs, but also give families an opportunity to be part of an established community. It would also facilitate family support for what is always a challenging career choice.
