Federal Parliament's Joint Standing Committee on the National Capital is investigating a proposal by the National Capital Authority to introduce pay parking in the Parliamentary Zone.

The introduction of pay parking is part of a proposed group of initiatives for the long-term development of the Parliamentary Zone, as set out in the *Parliamentary Zone Review Outcomes Report* released by the Authority in March 2000.

**The final public hearing is to be held in Committee Room 2S1 at Parliament House, Canberra, this Wednesday evening (13 August).**

The Committee will be hearing evidence from representatives from both the National Capital Authority and the ACT Government.
