



NBN Committee to hold hearing in Willunga

The Joint Committee on the National Broadband Network will hold an inspection and public hearing in Willunga, South Australia on 30 April as part of its ongoing review of the rollout of the National Broadband Network (NBN).

Willunga was the final of five first release sites to trial NBN services and has had access to the NBN fibre network since October 2011.

Committee Chair, Mr Oakeshott said "By visiting Willunga, the committee is aiming to gain a practical understanding of the NBN's impact on services available to and economic activity generated in regional towns."
