My name is \_\_\_\_\_ . I am British by birth, my father meeting my mother in Australia during the war. I have been an Australian Citizen, a fact of which I am extremely proud, since 1977. I am a Vietnam Veteran on a TPI Pension as a result of my wartime experiences.

That said, I am not a racist although with a name like \_\_\_\_\_ and my Latin appearances I have felt the barb of the racist spears many times, from childhood when we migrated to Australia in 1959 to adulthood from private citizens and public officers, namely the police. I therefore feel qualified to speak on a subject that I abhor.

I have travelled much more than the average person in my profession as salvage diver, than the ordinary person, spending considerable time in countries such as Indonesia, Singapore, Malaysia, Samoa, Cuba, Europe, American Samoa, Fiji, Papua New Guinea, United States and elsewhere.
