Inquiry into Defence Terrestrial Communications Network Facilities and Infrastructure Project

The Public Works Committee is conducting an inquiry into the Defence Terrestrial Communications Network Facilities and Infrastructure Project.

The Department of Defence has told the Committee that it relies on a highly complex Information and Communications Technology (ICT) environment to do business. This ICT environment is made up of a number of commercial, Government, specialist military and bespoke ICT systems operating over a range of networks, across a wide geographic area, providing ICT services to over 100,000 users.

A series of reviews has identified the need for Australian Government agencies, including Defence, to substantially improve the condition, capability, sustainability, productivity and governance of ICT, while targeting real reductions in the expenditure.

The project will set the foundation for all ICT reform and deliver significant business advantages to Defence by upgrading, replacing, standardising and rationalising the Defence Terrestrial Communications Network. It will also enable Defence to reduce network operating costs, reduce the complexity of the network and provide new collaborative business processes for ICT users.

The estimated cost of the project is \$131.1 million.

The Committee's Chair, Karen Andrews MP, said the Committee will conduct public and incamera hearings for the inquiry in Canberra on Friday, 30 May 2014.
