# **CHAPTER 1**

## Introduction

#### Referral

1.1 On 26 March 2015, the Senate referred the following matter to the Senate Finance and Public Administration Legislation Committee (committee) for inquiry and report by 13 May 2015:

The proposed Parliament House security upgrade works, including perimeter fencing, internal infrastructure changes and CCTV cameras, with particular reference to:

- (a) security and safety considerations;
- (b) project management;
- (c) value for money;
- (d) design integrity;
- (e) heritage impact;
- (f) moral rights;
- (g) impacts on building occupants and visitors; and
- (h) any related matters.<sup>1</sup>
- 1.2 On 12 May 2015, the Senate granted an extension of time for reporting until 25 June 2015.<sup>2</sup>

## Conduct of the inquiry

- 1.3 The inquiry was advertised on the committee's website. The committee invited submissions from interested individuals, organisations and the Department of Parliamentary Services (DPS) by 24 April 2015.
- 1.4 The committee received six public submissions. A list of individuals and organisations which made public submissions, together with other information authorised for publication by the committee, is at Appendix 1. The committee held a public hearing in Canberra on 14 May 2015. The proposed security upgrade works was also the subject of questioning during DPS' appearance at an estimates hearing on 25 May 2015. A list of witnesses who gave evidence at the public hearing on 14 May 2015 is available at Appendix 2.
